- Replace the water in the system annually for best results





WHAT DO I NEED?

- A slurry collection pit (recommended size of 500-1000 gallons)
- 5' x 10' of floor space
- A 3000 pound minimum forklift
- 1/4 or 3/8 inch airline with a minimum air supply of 80 psi and 3 cfm of air
- 3 phase Power disconnect nearby with 30 amp breaker (208,230,460 volts supported)
- Return plumbing line from the WaterBear (2" FPT) to your equipment
- Fresh water for any waterjet intensifier

WHAT DOES IT COST TO OPERATE?

- Less than \$1.00 per kitchen for supplies and operating costs
- Less than 15 minutes of proactive maintenance per week.
